From our Principal, Mr David Harriss

Hi everyone,

I would like to thank the whole school community for the way we have all come together and supported each other in a time of need over the past several months. We are certainly not at the end of this crisis, but quite likely the beginning of the end. There are still many families hurting and facing many challenges through unemployment, and we still need to be mindful of the messages coming from SA Health.

We have had around 90% of our students at school – a great achievement! While we have been supporting parent choice during this pandemic, we now expect all of our students who are well and not considered vulnerable to COVID-19 to attend school.

Students are required to attend school unless they are:

- Feeling unwell
- Have a chronic medical condition or compromised immune system and are not able to attend school on advice from their medical practitioner
- Live in a household with others who are deemed vulnerable to COVID-19 and are not able to attend school on advice of their medical practitioner
- Have been diagnosed with COVID-19 or have been required to self-isolate by SA Health

Restrictions on school camps and excursions (outside of the school grounds) have eased a little particularly around some SACE requirements. Appropriate hygiene measures will be followed and adults must continue to maintain physical distance (1.5m) and density (4sqm) requirements. Students must not attend if they are unwell. PE lessons can continue as usual, and from June 1 some non-contact sport competition can occur and contact sport training can recommence, but at this stage contact competitions are not allowed until June 25. Home Economics lessons are continuing as usual, with strict adherence to hygiene levels.

Parents should maintain the 1.5m physical distance between themselves and other adults (parents and teachers) at all times, including school drop off and pick up. Spectators at sport are restricted to 1 parent or carer per participant.

We are continuing to have extra cleaning at the school, expect staff and students to use the hand sanitiser supplied as they enter all classrooms, and are leaving all doors open in major traffic zones so students and staff do not need to open doors.

We will be extending the semester work period for as long as possible to try and recoup some of the lost time with the curriculum, so Semester 1 reports will not be processed until the start of term 3 (usually available at the end of term 2).

Bubbling along in the background of the COVID-19 crisis has been the planning and preparation for the \$20 million building program. The program's planned start is the beginning of Term 3 with a completion date of late in 2021. This will set us some logistical challenges initially, but as a community, we have proven our ability to rise above challenges with resilience, optimism, courage and knowledge, and I am sure we will continue to do so. Throughout the whole building process, the most important factor is going to be the education of our children, and whilst the physical environment in which they will be learning may vary, the learning process should not. I will communicate more details as they become available.

I would like to acknowledge all of the doctors and nurses and the entire medical support industry for the way they have carried out their vital roles during these times. I would also like to re-affirm the respect and admiration I have for my team of teachers and support staff here at school who have addressed each challenge with energy and enthusiasm, particularly as the expectations were constantly changing. I would also like to thank the community for their support and understanding, and hope that all those still facing challenges can see them through to happier and less stressful times.

RAA Donation of Vehicle to the Underdale Automotive Centre

In late November 2019 Daniel Muller Assessing Manager of the RAA was visiting the Underdale High Automotive Centre and became aware of the schools wish list to obtain another vehicle to add to the ones we have to use in the training programs that exist in the school.

In early 2020 Jeffry Jamieson Motor Assessor contacted the school to offer the centre a choice of any of the 3 vehicles the RAA was willing to donate. After considering the options it was decided the blue Toyota Rav 4 Cruiser would give the centre a vehicle which is much different to the 3 sedan Commodores that were been used in the automotive training of students at the school.

The donated vehicle was delivered at the school and has been used in the current MTA training programs that the year 11 and 12 automotive students are doing. The school is appreciative of this support as the cost of procuring vehicles to use in the training is an expensive element of the running costs of the Automotive Centre. To also be offered support in the future if the need arises, and more vehicles are needed, is a reflection of the RAA's continuing support of the community.
