It is with great pleasure that I write to you for the first time in 2021.

The start of the year has certainly been hectic for all of our students and staff with 75% of our school out of commission with the building works. I must say that I am very pleased by the manner in which our students and staff have shown resilience and flexibility around the physical spaces in which we have had to hold our classes. The focus has continued to remain on high impact teaching and learning strategies. Last week we were able to re-access the Knowledge corridor, giving us nine modern, high quality teaching spaces back and four offices back. Students and staff have revelled in learning spaces that are full of natural light, spacious and equipped with modern technology. It certainly has whet our appetite for the release of the Courage corridor (Science wing) which will also house our new Student Services centre. By the start of next term, we should have access to the new Creative Arts centre and Canteen, redeveloped Gymnasium and new Human Physical Performance centre, refurbished Automotive centre and new Metalwork shop, and the refurbished Furniture Construction building. I mentioned our focus on high impact teaching and learning strategies. In 2021, our Site Improvement Plan continues to target increasing student progress and achievement in Reading and Mathematics, and compliments these goals with increasing student progress and achievement in their grades, particularly in the A and B grade bands. Our Reading goal will target students being successful in increasing their vocabulary and comprehension, honing their skills and abilities in not only learning to read texts of increasing complexity, but to continue developing their ability in reading to learn. Our Mathematics goal will target students ability to understand the flexible concept of number (such as 50%, a half and 0.5, whilst looking different, all represent the same number), and their use of Mathematics language to explain to others the maths processes they use to solve problems (this may be you!) Our Grades improvement goal is targeting students' ability to understand what they are learning (and why), how they are doing (and how do they know), how they can improve, and where they can go to for help (this may also be you!) Each newsletter we will give you an update on how we are succeeding in these areas.

2021 is also about preparing to welcome Year 7 students into our family at Underdale High School. This year we have appointed leaders and teachers who have knowledge and experience in a Year 7 setting (either in a Primary School or R-12 School setting). Ms Melitta Kay is our Year 7 Leader and will be working with our feeder Primary Schools to help prepare our school for the Year 7's, and their Year 7's for our school. She will also be working with our Curriculum Team to plan our Junior Secondary Curriculum package. Mr John Katavatis, our Year 8 Leader, has been recruited from Flinders Park Primary school. Tahnee Manual, our Personalised Learning Leader came from Clapham Primary School, Mr Cornel Trifu from a primary School setting on Kangaroo Island and several of our other new appointments in 2021 have had opportunities to teach in a Year 7 setting. We have also appointed four Primary teachers through the Year 7 to High School program who will start in 2022 and get some specialised training this year in preparation (see article in Advertiser Friday 26th March). I believe we are very well prepared for the arrival of the Year 7's and that this combined experience will have a very positive impact on the other year levels in our Junior Secondary cohort.









Preparing for year 7 in high school in 2022

This year marks the start of a new phase for our education system, as we finalise our preparations to welcome your year 6 or year 7 child to high school in 2022.

Schools are working incredibly hard to ensure they are prepared for the move of year 7 to high school. As a department, we are making sure that your school has all the support they need to make this transition smooth and successful for you and your child.

This is a special year for students

It is a unique year, as year 6 and year 7 students will for the first and only time end their primary school journey together.

We want your child to have a positive experience in their final year of primary school. We understand the importance of rites of passage, such as graduation ceremonies, and our primary schools will do their very best to make this a memorable occasion for both year 6 and year 7 students.

Enrolling in high school for 2022

This year, families of year 6 and year 7 students will both be applying for and enrolling in high school through the department's statewide transition process.

You will receive details from your primary school early this year about how to apply for and enrol in your local public high school, so I encourage you to keep an eye out for this key information.

If you are unsure of which high school zone you live in, you can use the 'Find a school' tool on the department's website at www.education.sa.gov.au

Engaging with your new school

There may be opportunities for you to connect with your child's new high school before next year.

Schools will generally have open days, information sessions or principal tours for prospective families to learn about the unique programs, systems and offerings of the high school.

As the situation with COVID-19 continues to change, schools will operate in line with the latest SA Health advice, which may mean alternate and innovative ways to engage. This might include activities such as virtual tours and online webinars. I encourage you to explore how to engage with your local high school by visiting their website or social media pages, or contacting the school directly.


We are working together
