Dear parents and caregivers,


#### **Student Learning**

Learning Area Prefects – Instructional Rounds. In 2022 we have introduced Student Prefects in each Learning Area, and these students will initially work closely with staff leaders in the areas of English and Languages, Maths, Technologies, Arts, Science, Humanities, Health and Physical Education. The Learning Area Prefects will provide feedback to staff around learning in classrooms in each of the above areas during an Instructional Round.

Feedback - Staff will continue to focus on the use of feedback strategies to support our Teaching Sprints where we will continue to plan, trial, and review our work, collecting student evidence throughout the term. Staff have been examining wellbeing, grade, and Literacy and Numeracy data to help prepare for the teaching sprints with their new classes. Supported by the Departments' Local Education Team, and the Department of Education Project officers, staff are working to develop resources and design learning. This work will further strengthen student engagement, by challenging, and stretching thinking so that students may achieve their personal best. At Underdale High School we use Monday morning and Tuesday afternoon to provide staff time to plan this very important work. We do ask that students are not on site until 9:20am on Monday mornings as this is staff professional learning time and there is no formal supervision until 9:20am on this day.

Engaging a Generation - Learning Environments from Virtual Reality to Community Garden - I recently distributed an article to the leaders about student engagement and why there is an urgency to reconnect students to school life. Young people are increasingly exposed to the instant gratification the digital age provides through Netflix, gaming, social media, other software applications and online chat groups. This is a conversation we need to have as a community as we build our student life programs

and develop our learning environments to support and connect this generation. We need to provide agency to students and educators, to support opportunities for decision making around how our learning spaces can be engaging and relevant to young people. We already have newly renovated contemporary facilities which students are enjoying. We are partnering with Lumination https:// lumination.com.au/ to consider how we can provide digital learning spaces including Virtual Reality that help to bring curriculum to life for students. We have also partnered with Programmed https://programmed.com. au/maintenance/property-services/grounds/ to build a landscaped garden that provides learning spaces outside for students, including Indigenous plants, a Yarning Circle, outdoor performance stage, nature pond and seating. Year 7 Students will engage in tree planting for this space on Friday August 12th. We are introducing new subjects to Underdale High school and are very excited to announce that Dance is now in our curriculum. In 2023 we will introduce Coffee Culture, Earth and Environmental Science and Society and Culture.

# PISA 2022

#### PISA is coming to our school!

Our school is participating in the Programme for International Student Assessment (PISA), which is taking place in Australian between 18 July and 9 September 2022.

PISA is an important part of the National Assessment Program in Australia, which is the measure through which governments, education authorities and schools can determine whether or not young Australians are meeting important educational outcomes. All Australian Education Ministers have agreed to Australian schools' participation in PISA, which is reflected in the Australian Education Act 2013.

International assessments provide a wide range of valuable information for education policy and review in Australia and overseas and also enable Australia to consider the performance of our education system compared with others.

Since the first PISA assessment involving 32 countries in 2000, the survey has continued to raise interest amongst educators and policy-makers world-wide. In 2022, Australia will be one of over 85 countries participating in PISA with around

15,000 students (from around 800 schools) representing our country.

What will PISA mean for our school?

A random sample of 15-year-old, mostly from Years 10 and 11, will be sampled to complete a two-hour computer-based assessment consisting of mathematics, science, reading, and creative thinking. These students will also be asked to complete a questionnaire.

A random sample of teachers will be asked to compete an online questionnaire which will collect information on classroom instruction, teachers' educational backgrounds, training, and teaching experiences.

As an international assessment, every participating school and student has an important role in showing the rest of the world what Australia can do.

ACER will provide our school and participating students with a certificate, recognising our contribution. Each student will also receive access to the Insight video series.

### Snooker Prodigy Jason Yu Takes Out U16 National Title

Before his against-the-odds triumph at the under-16 National Snooker Championships in Albury on Saturday, child prodigy Jason Yu had already captured the imagination of the Darwin eightball community.

And that was why the president of the Darwin and District Eightball Association, John Hilton, was delighted at the 13-year-old's victory over Lilly Meldrum in the final.

Meldrum – a runner-up at the women's under-21 snooker world championship – beat the now-Adelaide resident Jason in the Australian under-21 championships in April.

But Jason's determination to continue improving never wavered, turning around that result and triumphing 3-1 over Meldrum in the national-title decider in Albury.

With the snooker world now at his feet, Jason was proud to represent the Northern Territory after his family moved to Adelaide to further his snooker career in May.

Hilton said the Darwin community got behind Jason because of his incredible work ethic, humility and love of the contest – even against grown adults with a lot more years of experience.


