Student Voice Report

Feedback for year 12 formal:

cultural and heritage beliefs are still as important to the living Kaurna people today.

- The price paid did not feel worth (opinion from majority of students).
- Food was average and did not live up to expectations of price. Students who had dietary requirements were especially disappointed with the food as the alternatives were bland and just not worth the price spent.
- DJ did not take into consideration any of the songs that were organised by students and given to him prior to formal. (He did take SOME recommendations, but it was when students had to ASK him.)
- Photobooth was not organised well. Some students had more opportunities to take MULTIPLE pictures throughout the night.

The photobooth that was chosen was rushed but also had instructions that were not clearly communicated.

Planned events:

Non-uniform day (Red cross day fundraiser) 1st July:

- Red theme not required but is encouraged to be worn by students.
- Food stalls (run by SVC members and food and tech students)
- Foods sold such as cookies and cupcakes.
- Presentation for society and culture

Students' uniforms:

- To prevent students from wearing non-uniform items (such as hoodies, puffer-jackets) some students have requested school puffer jackets or perhaps something that can keep them warm and prevent them from being drenched from rain.
- Some schools such as Adelaide high school and Botanic high school have recently implemented a school puffer jacket into uniform.
- The main concerns is around the current cold and wet weather which our uniforms are not suitable for, e.g., the track jacket has a hoodie, but it cannot protect students from the rain and despite its appearance, it is not waterproof.

Other:

- Lack of outdoor eating areas suitable for the weather discussed with Ms. Michaels.
- Graduation dinner (for future year 12 graduations) for parent's opinions on whether they
 would like this rather than just sitting and listening.
- Not making students wear uniform for graduation (other schools already do this e.g., St Dominic, Woodville high, Modbury heights etc.) semi-formal would be the dress-code.
