EMS – discussion around issues. Feedback from all staff has gone into the department. In this report I refer to our newsletter article. Recent events have highlighted the strength of our staff and leadership here at Underdale to work swiftly and proactively, maintaining our core values and high expectations. Lieutenant-General David Morrison, addressed the nation in response to unacceptable conduct that potentially brought the Australian Army into disrepute, but also let down all those others, past and present, who respectfully and socially go about their business doing great work day after day. The phrase he used I often refer to here at Underdale, "the standard we walk past, is the standard we accept." We are all responsible for the culture and reputation we create, bystanders included, and we must always protect the rights of others to feel safe. We are all working hard collectively because we believe we can and do make a difference facilitating opportunities for young people to thrive at Underdale High School.

Our **Acquaintance night** held early this term was an opportunity for families to meet home class teachers and connect to the **Community Portal**. Families attending were grateful for the opportunity to meet staff and gain important information ready for the year. Whilst we navigate our new system, we are working closely with the Department for Education to iron out problems and feedback concerns. Many, of the glitches we have encountered should be resolved in the coming weeks, however if you continue to have issues, please let us know.

The **Celebration assembly** in week two provided an opportunity for two outstanding students to speak to the whole school about their outstanding achievements, university offers, lessons learnt and

importantly to ask for help. They both reflected on the great teaching staff here at Underdale and how significant they have *all* been in supporting their success. Their advice to students centred around connection with teachers, and how important it was to ask for help, because the support is there for you if you need it.

What's NEW?

Café Culture is a new subject here at Underdale in 2023, and students have been making staff coffee, mocha's and latte's, delivering them around the school as they learn the craft of the barista. Students I have chatted to have expressed how wonderful it feels to make people happy. As we consider the wellbeing of our students, we easily forget they have been thrown into a consumer culture of what can I get, rather than what can I give. Giving connects us as citizens, giving makes us feel great, validates our importance as individuals and as a community. Café Culture supports entrepreneurship as well of course, but community connection is at its heart too. Congratulations to the food technology team for driving this work.

Lumination Lab is here, and our staff champions are trailing this work in preparation for the official launch later this term. Observing staff, students and even our Governing Council Chair trial this space has been an absolute joy. The ability of the lab to provide tailored and shared experiences for learning to be explored in a dynamic and collaborative way is mind-blowing. We look forward to sharing this at our launch on Open Night, March 27th.

Community Picnic - Affiliated Parent Committee

We were all blown away by the response from families attending our picnic on Sunday 12th February, it was a mammoth effort by the committee, particularly as it was our first as a school. I am extremely grateful to our chair Judy Masters and Julie Busuttil for spending many hours preparing, setting up and running the event. We are also grateful to staff, students and families who supported and or attended, helping to make this event the success it was. Some of our students made a profit on their stalls, a great reward for their entrepreneurship presentation of learning. We are now planning for this to be an annual event.

International Program

We launched an extensive International Program this year, greater than the school has seen for some time. We have students visiting from around the world and recently connected with students from across the state. We are constantly looking for Homestay families to sustain this unique program, and Covid has placed some amnesia around the significance around international connections. We know the benefits an international program can be far reaching for local students in terms of learning about cultural difference and developing an appreciation for the diversity of curriculum offerings Australian schools offer, something we can easily take for granted locally. We are also investigating further international exchanges to be announced later this year.

Advanced Life Photography

We have sourced a new school photo provider who have presented a professional package shared at governing council and they have begun taking photos of students, and staff. Advanced Life are also working behind the scenes gathering footage for a promotional video for Underdale.

Technology upgrades

Security cameras have now been installed across the entire school. Staff are working behind the scenes to upgrade and link screens across the school for better communication of events, it will also provide a chance to share learning activities and students' ideas internally. We have installed a screen in our school gym that can be used for students as they review and evaluate their sporting performance skills, as well as value add to presentations and assemblies.

Year 12 Formal

What a fabulous evening it was on Friday 24th February at the Adelaide Convention Centre, how wonderful to see all our year 12s unrecognisable in their smart attire. We saw some truly outstanding outfits and some great dancing including the Waltz, Zorba, Nutbush and the Macarena! Some things don't change. The formal committee and senior school team needs to be congratulated on their set up and organisation, from centre pieces to award presentations, sashes, and delicious menu. The Convention Centre staff commented on the outstanding behaviour of all our students, apparently not always common from those that hire the venue. We look forward to seeing some of the photos.

Literacy for Learning

Our learning goal this semester is to Increase student achievement in literacy, specifically in writing. During our week 0 program staff worked with Bronwyn Custance to unpack the use of model texts to support writing. Our Professional Learning Day on Friday March 10th will provide further opportunity for staff to unpack writing genres of their subject and support students strengthen their ability to articulate responses.
